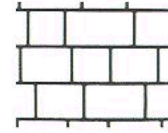




Shopping List



- Before you start your project there are number of items you'll need to ensure the job goes as smoothly as possible.
- We've put together a list of recommend items. Print the list and take it along to your local hardware store next time you go shopping.
- This list can also be used as a check list for your employees prior to heading out to a project.

Tools & Supplies "for preparing the surface"

This will be one of the most important steps to ensuring a good job. Having the right tools will make this job a lot easier.

Here's what you'll need

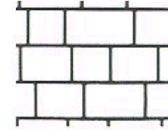
- < > broom or blower (broom dust and dirt from the surface prior to washing)
- < > 4" putty knife (used to scrape any material not removed by brooming)
- < > garden hose (low pressure high volume for washing the surface)
- < > spray nozzle (spray nozzle for supplying pressure)
- < > stiff bristle broom (stiff bristle broom for brushing clean the wet surface)
- < > mild detergent (dishwashing or laundry detergent in warm water)
- < > degreaser (tuff stuff of simple green to clean oil or grease spots)
- < > crack filler (flexible crack filler used to fill cracks in driveway surface)
- < > plastic sheet (testing to ensure surface is dry, 24" x 24" plastic sheet)

Tools & Supplies "for installing your nicedriveway"

- < > 5 gal mixing pails (mix coating, make sure you have a couple extra pails)
- < > 5 gal wash pails (don't mix in these pails, good idea to have two)
- < > 1/2" variable drill (a variable speed drill is important, 600 rpm is ideal)
- < > mixing paddle (a 5" jiffler twin blade works well pulling the coating inward)
- < > drop cloth (canvas drop cloth to mix coating on, soaks up spilt coating)
- < > masking tape (3/4" painters tape doesn't leave a film when removed)
- < > duct tape (sticks to concrete & asphalt surfaces, tape down roofing felt)
- < > roofing felt (heavy and doesn't blow around in the wind)
- < > small paint brush (works well for cleaning tools in the cleaning bucket)

Tools & Supplies

“for installing your nice driveway”

- < > large paint brush (coating in areas that are too tight to spray, roll or broom)
- < > cleaning tools (spinners and scrapers are handy for cleaning brushes)
- < > long nap roller (pushes coating into the rough surface of your project)
- < > roller & handle (good sturdy roller carriage and handle)
- < > concrete broom (thin soft bristle concrete broom, to apply the first coat)
- < > hopper gun (needs swivel base, allows spraying horizontal surface)
- < > compressor (match required pressure from hopper, 40 psi standard)
- < > cleaning tools (check manufacturers recommended cleaning procedures)
- < > stencils (variety of patterns to use on concrete and asphalt)
- < > border stencils (use border stencils to frame a job or as an accent)
- < > 3/4” strapping tape (finish areas where stencils don’t fit, or for large patterns)
- < > stencil coat (concrete & asphalt coating for durable long life surface)
- < > liquid tint (a variety of colors used to tint your coating onsite)
- < > anti-slip aggregate (add texture and slip resistance to your top coat)
